AIMEE E. LIU Booktalk / Book Signing Slides

Aimee E. Liu's novel draws on family stories, photos, letters and historical documents to tell the story of her grandparents' forbidden love in America and in China. He was a Chinese scholar - revolutionary, she was a white American who tutored him English. When the 1906 earthquake struck San Francisco, he saved her life. Together for 30 difficult years, mainly in war-ravaged China, discrimination haunted them and their children. Slides will accompany her talk.

Liu is also the author of <u>FACE</u>, a novel about an Amerasian photographer and Solitaire. She was an associate producer for NBC's TODAY show before turning to writing full-time.

# CHSSC CELEBRATES CH'ING MING AT MEMORIAL SHRINE IN EVERGREEN CEMETERY

Bundled against the weather, a small crowd of Society members and friends gathered on Saturday, April 4th, paying homage to early Los Angeles Chinese by re-initiating the Ch'ing Ming festival that was held in Evergreen Cemetery for almost a century, until the 1960's. A brief ceremony was led by Board Chairman Irvin Lai under the large canopy set up for the event. CHSSC Board Member and USC Anthropologist, Dr. Eugene Cooper, spoke on the ritual, symbolism, and meaning of Ch'ing Ming. Three commemorative pine trees were then planted beside the shrine's wrought-iron fence. The shrine was adorned with red foiled-covered pots of bright-red azaleas Delicious varieties of dim sum were served to participants.

Due to the rainy weather, the event was modestly attended; however, many present felt it was a meaningful activity -- one they look forward to sharing each year.

Otherwise, the work would probably be done at the Society's Bernard Street houses where the photography will also be in progress.
- 2. We are in need of Society members to help in the transportation of the artifacts to be photographed from their present location in storage in Santa Monica to the Society's Bernard Street houses for photographing, and return to storage in Santa Monica. Your time is of the greatest importance, but if you can also provide a vehicle with which to move the artifacts, that would also be welcome.



# UNDERGRADUATE MULTICULTURAL SUMMER INTERNSHIPS

The Museum of Chinese American History at El Pueblo de Los Angeles Historical Monument is seeking two undergraduate multicultural summer interns. They are to work with the El Pueblo staff to create a new interpretive exhibit showcasing the artifact collections of the Museum of Chinese American History.

Training will be offered in the areas of exhibit development, oral history, research with archival materials, and collection management. The interns will also have the opportunity to attend four events with other Getty summer interns which will be held by various cultural organizations during the grant period.

OUALIFICATIONS: The internships are open to currently enrolled undergraduates who are members of ethnic groups that are under-represented in professions related to museums. Applicants should 1) have completed at least one semester of college by June 1997; 2) not graduating before December 1997; and 3) be a resident of or attending college in the Los Angeles area. The applicants must also have the ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing. Computer literacy is desired.

### **Immediate Need**

### Job Description.

Candidate shall support the day-to-day operations of the projects and programs of the Chinese Historical Society of Southern California under the supervision of the president or his/her designee. Candidate shall coordinate and conduct walking tours, and will assist in their development and marketing. The candidate may also give support to the preparation and marketing of the Society's publication and other Chinese American educational tools and materials. The candidate may also give support to maintenance and development of the Society's Archives. Duties may include some aspects of office operations and management, including the supervision of interns. Coordinating volunteers will be an important, frequent task. The work week will be Tuesday through Saturday, for a total of 20-24 hours per week.

#### Qualifications.

Minimum of a bachelor's degree in one or more of the following disciplines required: humanities, social sciences, business administration, marketing, public relations, or related subject. Demonstrated knowledge of Asian American studies or history also highly preferred. Good writing and very strong oral communications skills shall be required of the successful candidate. Very good interpersonal, team building, and organizing skills will be essential. Bilingual abilities involving Chinese language are desirable. Experience with computers and software for business and office applications is expected.

Employment Conditions: Range of \$10-15 per hour. No benefits except 3 paid national holidays. Parking expenses paid. Job could grow to long-term, full time.


