RECENT BOARD ACTIONS. Since few members find time to attend CHSSC Board of Directors meetings, the Board will attempt from time to time to announce key actions. In the period from May to September, the Board

1. Sanctioned membership on the Community Advisory Committee of the Chinatown Community Redevelopment Project (CRA). The current representative is Munson Kwok.

2. Voted a research grant of \$500 to Harry Lawton, University of California, Riverside, to continue research and writing on a major history, "Orange Groves and Ricebowls." The money would help to support research assistants.

3. Worked on a Memorandum of Understanding between El Pueblo Park and CHSSC regarding the Founding Donors Program and the Museum of Chinese American History. Discussions are not yet completed.

4. Established as an interest bearing trust fund, The Chinese American Museum Fund, to which all museum donations are escrowed. Current trustees are Munson Kwok, Ella Quan, and Howard Quon.
