MOTHER LODE FIELD TRIP ELECTION OF BOARD MEMBER

PROGRAM: "AN INTERVIEW WITH JUDGE DELBERT E. WONG"

Judge Delbert Wong, a native of California, was born in Hanford, and raised in Bakersfield. He received his Bachelor of Science degree from U.C. Berkeley, and his law degree from Stanford University. He has the unique distinction of being the first person of Chinese descent to be appointed as judge in California.

Recently retired, Judge Wong completed 30 years of public service -- three years on the legal staff of the California State Legislature, seven years as Deputy Attorney General of California, three years as Judge of the Municipal Court, and 18 years as Judge of the Superior Court.

The interview will touch on the highlights of the Judge's career, his perceptions of the legal profession, and some of his varied experiences during his years "on the bench".

As a man much dedicated to helping his community, Judge Wong has served on the boards of numerous civic organizations. He and his wife Dolores, both Society Life Members, are the parents of four children, and are highly respected and well-loved citizens of the community.
