

HELP RESTORE BURNED LIBRARIES - The Los Angeles Public Library's John Muir Branch and Junipero Serra Branch were totally destroyed by fire during the L.A. riot. These branches are currently providing service in leased mini-mall locations as their historic buildings do not meet earthquake standards. Six more branches were ransacked and equipment/library materials were stolen. It will take \$750,000 to replace the books and equipment. Bookmobiles are providing services to the affected areas in the interim.
