"CHINESE AND ASIAN AMERICANS"

Speaker: Jerry Wong

In the past two decades, there has been a dramatic rise in the population of Americans of Asian ancestry in the United States and especially in California. Who are these people? What is the composition of this society? Are they old or young? What are their occupations? Income? Poverty levels? What is the make up of the Chinese American population? Finally, what are the projections of the composition of our society in the year 2050?
