# STRANGERS FROM A NORTHERN SHORE:

An Architectural and Historical Exploration of Vancouver's Chinese Community by Andrew Yan

Vancouver, Canada is one of the last remaining significantly-sized historic Chinatowns in North America. This talk will be an architectural exploration of Vancouver's Chinatown and how it is associated with the changing demographics of the city's Chinese Canadian community. Interestingly, just as the Chinese represent 28 percent of Vancouver's population, Chinatown is currently in significant economic trouble. This is a problem that seems to be facing Chinatowns throughout the West Coast of North America. Consequently, this talk will also be on the future of Chinatowns in the brave new world of overseas Chinese migration and money.

Andrew Yan is a Master's student at UCLA's Urban Planning program. He is currently researching a thesis on revitalization strategies in the Chinatowns of Vancouver and LosAngeles. He holds an honours degree in Geography and Political Science from Simon Fraser University and when not researching, he is in search of the ultimate beef brisket on rice in Los Angeles.

#### **CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTION**

If you have appreciated stock in a corporation that you have held for over one year, the stock can be contributed to the Society with very favorable tax results to all concerned.

As the contributor, you may take a charitable contribution deduction on your tax return for the full value of the stock on the date of the transfer. You would not report the stock contributed as income on your tax return. This contribution of appreciated stock benefits you in that your itemized deduction is for the full value of your stock contribution without an offset for income.

The Society benefits with a contribution for the full value of the stock contribution rather than net of taxes. The Society qualifies as an exempt organization under IRC Section 501 ©(3).
