Anna May Wong ~ Frosted Yellow Willows: Her Life, Times and Legend



May is Asian Pacific American Heritage Month. The Chinese Historical Society of Southern California (CHSSC) will be screening "Anna May Wong ~ Frosted Yellow Willows: Her Life, Times and Legend" (2007) narrated by Nancy Kwan. It is the first biographical documentary film on the first Asian American actress to achieve international and Hollywood stardom both in silent and early talking films. This Anna May Wong (1905-1961) 10-year in-the-making documentary film has screened and premiered in Pordenone, Italy; London, England; Glasgow, Scotland; Melbourne, Australia as well as major cities within the United States and in England. It aired on TCM (Turner Classic Movies) in 2008. Producer/director Elaine Mae Woo will be present.


Veteran Recognition Plaques Let You Personally Honor Your Heroes Abroad, Heroes at Home

2014 Ching Ming Festival

On Saturday, April 5, 2014, the CHSSC hosted the annual Ching Ming (Chinese Memorial Day) Festival. Ceremonies took place at the Los Angeles County Crematorium and continued at the historic Chinese Memorial Shrine at Evergreen Cemetery. The Shrine stands at the center of what was once a 19th century Chinese cemetery. Built in 1888 by the people of Los Angeles' Old Chinatown, the Shrine is considered the earliest extant Chinese structure in Los Angeles.
