

IN MEMORIAM

Angi Ma Wong



Angi Ma Wong was a Charter member, two-time CHSSC president, Golden Spike Award Recipient Honoree, and friend.

She was an award-winning businesswoman and best-selling author for both adults and children. Her notable works include her best-selling Feng Shui Dos and Taboos ® series and award-winners: TARGET: The U.S. Asian Market, Barack Obama: Historymaker, Meet President Obama and the newest release, A Survivor's Secrets to Health & Happiness, which won four book awards.

Angi founded her intercultural and feng shui consultancy and corporate training business in 1989 and her publishing company, Pacific Heritage Books in 1992. Through writing, publishing, public speaking and seminars, she bridges cultures for understanding and profitability between Asians and non-Asians. Known as The Feng Shui Lady®, Angi appeared on OPRAH, Regis and Kelly, CNN Headline News, CBS Sunday Morning. She was also featured in over 600 print, broadcast, and Internet features, as well as, TIME, PEOPLE and Redbook.

Angi became an active member in Rotary International District 5280 and the Palos Verdes Sunset Rotary Club in 1993. After becoming president in 2001-02, she remained an integral part of their organization: Asst.Governor 2003-04, 2004-06, Leadership Breakfast chair 2008-09 and Sr. Asst. Governor 2006-07 & 2009-10, and Rotarian team leader for the month-long Group Study Exchange to Mexico in 2006-07. For the past 17 years, she facilitated Rotarians, families and youth to march with the CHSSC in leading the Chinese New Year parade. In addition, Angi also served as a Board member of the Palos Verdes Chamber of Commerce, Friends of Banning Museum, and the Development Board of Torrance Memorial Medical Center.

Friends and members remember her for her strong spirit, determination, energy, and positive attitude despite fighting cancer for 26 years. CHSSC conveys its heartfelt condolences to Angi's husband, Norman, and their family.

IN MEMORIAM

Janet D. Wong

Janet was born February 20, 1952 in Los Angeles to parents Ralph and Rose Wong. Her birth completed the family with older brother Ralph and older sister Judy. Her love for music and dance began in elementary school and continued through high school where she performed in their annual musical productions. Chinese Presbyterian was her church from kindergarten through adult. Through church, life-long friendships were formed.

Janet graduated from UC Santa Cruz with a Bachelors in Economics. She returned to the Los Angeles area upon graduation and began employment at Security Pacific Bank as a Management Science Analyst in the Operations Research Department and continued until leaving as Assistant Controller-Senior Financial Systems Analyst. Her research work was the foundation for the ATM machines we currently use today. She then worked as the MIS Project Manager in the Financial Systems Division at Avery Label Company in Azusa. In 1979, she joined Logica Data Architects as a Consultant-Senior Analyst where she lived and worked in Waltham, Massachusetts, San Francisco and Los Angeles. After leaving Logica Data Architects she was a Consultant Business Analyst for other companies until her retirement. Beside her expertise in banking she also had vast knowledge in the business applications of insurance, general finance, telecommunications, law enforcement-judicial, and entertainment. She also obtained a Federal/California Tax Preparation Certificate.

Janet's special cooking was from some of her mother's recipes; Noh Mai Faan for the holidays to the Lemon Chiffon Pie she had made In recent years, Janet also enjoyed various craft activities and often made gifts for family and friends. Upon retirement, Janet used her knowledge and skills as a board member at her condo association.

Janet and I were close in age, born within a year of each other and shared many childhood interests. We were cousins on our mothers' side, the Lee family. Our generation had 15 cousins and annually gathered to celebrate Grandpa's birthday. Our family gatherings continue today with the annual Easter Egg Hunt. She was "Auntie Jan." to many.

As we grew older our families became closer. More than cousins and friends, I became a sister. Her sudden passing leaves us with an emptiness in our hearts and lives. I will always remember her sincere love, care, and interest for each person in her life and her joy she expressed for each. Janet you may be gone but will live on in my memories.
