Long-time CHSSC member, community volunteer, and philanthropist, Dr. Annie Siu, has written her memoir. She details her unusual path to becoming an orthodontist in Alhambra, CA.

Her story begins with her father coming to America. Annie writes of her immigrant family's struggles and brings voice to her everyday life growing up in San Francisco Chinatown in the 1930 and 1940's. She explains her unlikely choice to apply to dental school where she is the first Chinese woman to be admitted to the UC San Francisco dental school and the only woman in her dental school class. After her marriage to Tim Siu, Annie and Tim moved to Alhambra to begin their professional careers and their family. Join us to support Annie and follow her life as she becomes an "accidental dentist."

Ching Ming Remembrance at Riverside, CA

Save Riverside Chinatown-Save Our Chinatown Committee (SOCC) hosted the 7th annual Ching Ming Remembrance to honor Chinese pioneers at Olivewood Memorial Park in Riverside, California. Ching Ming is an annual Chinese rite, similar to Dia de las Muertos; it is the Chinese day of remembering our ancestors by visiting the cemetery, cleaning their graves, and providing offerings of wine and food. Although the normal practice is to honor the ancestors in one's direct line, most of the Chinese pioneers buried in Riverside left no descendants due to the 1882 Chinese Exclusion Act, discriminatory laws, and later extensions of those laws. From the 1880s until the 1940s, the Riverside Chinatown community took care of honoring the dead. This was necessary because families in China could not properly honor their ancestors overseas. Since 2009, after a hiatus of about 60 years, the SOCC revived the observation and invited the public to learn about this Chinese remembrance tradition in Riverside. Increased awareness of this important annual Chinese cultural practice has spurred additional cultural preservation projects.
